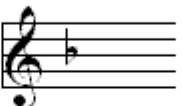
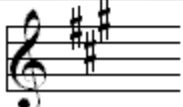
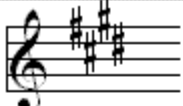
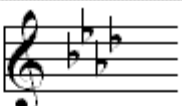
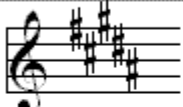
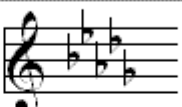
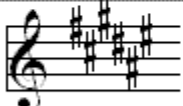
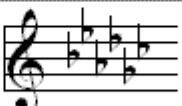
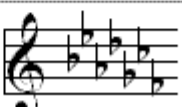


Grade 5. Key signatures
